

Jonathan Stephen

Jonathan has been the Principal of WEST since September 2006. He completed nearly 28 years in pastoral ministry, first at Amyand Park Chapel in Twickenham and then at Carey Baptist Church in Reading. Jonathan is a past President of the Fellowship of Independent Evangelical Churches (1998-2001) and Director of Affinity (2003-2009).

Bob Letham

Bob is Director of Research and lectures in systematic and historical theology. A Presbyterian minister, Bob has served congregations in New Jersey and Wilmington, Delaware, the latter for over 17 years. He has taught theology at London School of Theology, Westminster Theological Seminary (Philadelphia) and Reformed Theological Seminary (Washington DC/Baltimore).





Mike Reeves

Mike is a member of WEST's Executive Management and Director of Union. Previously, Mike was Head of Theology for UCCF, providing theological fuel for student mission and supporting undergraduates studying theology. Before that he was an Associate Minister at All Souls Church, Langham Place, in London.

Cor Bennema

Cor is Senior Lecturer in New Testament. Originally from Holland, prior to coming to WEST he served as Associate Professor and Head of New Testament at the South Asia Institute of Advanced Christian Studies in Bangalore, India. He has published many articles and books.





Mark Pickett

Mark is our Director of Undergraduate Studies and lectures in missiology. For twenty years he was involved in evangelism, Bible teaching, leadership training, research, writing, and publishing, principally in Nepal and India. Nepal's Tribhuvan University awarded him a PhD for his study of the Newar people of the Kathmandu Valley.



John Kendall

John is the Undergraduate Admissions Tutor, dealing with undergraduate enquiries. After teaching high school biology for 13 years, John came to WEST first as a student. John teaches Greek grammar, Greek text and introductory Bible reading skills. His passion is to help students interpret the Bible with both exegetical rigour and contemporary relevance.

Iwan Rhys Jones

Iwan is Director of Postgraduate Studies and lectures in Hebrew and Old Testament, having obtained his MPhil from the University of Wales. Iwan entered the pastoral ministry, ministering in Welsh, with churches affiliated to the Union of Welsh Independents (Congregational), and then served as Associate Pastor at Deeside Evangelical Church.





Phil Hill

Phil has been appointed by WEST as Lecturer in Pastoral Theology and Church Theologian at Large. Phil has immense pastoral experience in both Wales and England. Previously, he served as Dean of Students at Nazareth Evangelical Theological Seminary in Galilee, while also working with Arab Baptist churches. As well as teaching Pastoral Studies, he is a Modern Church historian, specialising in the history of British evangelicalism.

Tom Holland

Tom obtained his PhD in Pauline Studies from the University of Wales. He is the author of many academic papers, but it is his ground breaking book *Contours of Pauline Theology* and, most recently, *Romans: The Divine Marriage*, *A Biblical Theological Commentary* which have given him an international profile and attracted students to WEST from around the world.

Lee Gatiss

Lee is the Editor of 'The Theologian: the internet journal for integrated theology', (www.theologian.org.uk), and Review Editor of the international theology journal 'Churchman'. He read history at Oxford University before training for Anglican ministry at Oak Hill Theological College in London. He has served in churches in Oxford, Kettering, and London, most recently as Associate Minister at St. Helen's, Bishopsgate. He holds a ThM in Historical and Systematic Theology from Westminster Theological Seminary in Philadelphia.

Marcus Honeysett

After postgraduate studies in Postmodern Philosophy, Marcus worked for many years for UCCF, including leading the work for the Greater London area. He is Director of the training ministry 'Living Leadership', providing training and on-going pastoral nurture for leaders and spouses. Marcus serves on the leadership team of Crofton Baptist Church as elder for training and discipleship.





Ted Turnau

Ted was raised in Pennsylvania. In 1999, shortly after completing his PhD, Ted and his family relocated to Prague in the Czech Republic, where Ted has been teaching cultural and religious studies at Anglo-American University in Prague. He has also taught as a visiting lecturer at the Social Sciences Faculty of Charles University, also in Prague. In 2004, he helped to found the Christian International School of Prague.

Do you need to improve your language skills?

The International Foundation Course (IFC)



The International Foundation Course (IFC) provides students from non-English-speaking countries with sufficient English skills to progress confidently to further theological study, or simply to communicate more effectively in both Christian and secular situations.

The unique feature of the IFC is that it teaches English specifically for theology and gospel communication – with extensive use of the Bible and other Christian sources. The course prepares students for University of Cambridge English language examinations up to university entry level.

Living with students from the UK and all over the world provides students with daily English practice on WEST's campus. As students attend a local church, their confidence and spiritual maturity can grow through opportunities to serve and meet with other Christians. There are regular day trips to local and national tourist attractions and Christian heritage sites, as well as a trip to a European country.



Tim Steele (Programme Leader)

Tim spent several years teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) both in the UK and abroad before coming to study at WEST. He has been involved in ministry amongst international students over the past five years.


BA (Hons) Theology & BD


The BA is designed to equip students for a wide range of ministry opportunities in all cultural settings. The flexibility of the programme meets the needs of those from a broad spectrum of backgrounds and with a variety of ministry goals. Students cover all the foundational aspects of a good theology degree while being able to explore many differing options. The Bachelor of Divinity (BD) is awarded to those who have completed a minimum of 60 credits of language modules spread across the three levels.


The course can be followed full-time (3 years) or part-time (up to 7 years), on campus or by distance learning. (Students may exit after the first or second level with a Certificate or Diploma of Higher Education in Theology.)

Graduate Diploma in Theology

This two-year, part-time, off-campus programme is aimed at those who already possess significant ministry experience and a good degree (upper second class or above) in an unrelated subject.

The course covers all foundational aspects of theology while offering options (including biblical languages) to meet differing needs. The course is particularly suited to those who cannot spare three years for full-time study. It can be taken as a standalone programme or as the foundation for a Master's degree.

The Graduate Diploma is only delivered in church-centred learning communities. These operate at the regional level and are intended to provide enhanced support for distance learners. Through the learning community, students can meet and encourage one another and access local theological resources.

Experienced pastors and theologians provide tutorial and mentoring support to students, in addition to the primary delivery of teaching via digital environments. All staff are trained in, and integrated into, WEST's culture and systems.

WEST is forming a network of learning hubs, educators, churches and students, all interacting with the main Bryntirion campus – truly 'Bringing the Academy into Missional Church'.




MA in Contemporary Church Leadership


The MACCL is a programme of study which is vocationally orientated, with the needs and concerns of the pastoral ministry in mind. The course considers aspects of church leadership and pastoral ministry in a scholarly way.

The MA would be equally suited to individuals embarking on serious theological study with a pastoral dimension, or to working pastors wishing to have some intellectual stimulation in the context of ongoing ministry.


Looking to deepen your appreciation of Scripture?

MTh Theology in Scriptural Context

This course is a taught postgraduate programme which provides an opportunity to explore and reflect critically upon a range of topics from an evangelical and specifically reformed perspective. The doctrine of Scripture is at the heart of the programme and is a core module. This module is complemented by others which seek to relate Scripture and theology to diverse topics.


The MTh Theology in Scriptural Context is suitable for serving pastors or other Christian workers seeking an intellectual stimulus and challenge in their ministries. The programme also serves as an excellent preparation for further academic theological study by research.

Research







MPhil and PhD

The MPhil and PhD are postgraduate awards achieved following the production of a thesis and its successful defence in an oral examination. Research students must have the necessary theological and academic background and their chosen field of research must be judged as capable of edifying the Church worldwide. Benefits of a research degree at WEST include the ability to study a subject in considerable depth within a confessionally reformed context.

There are no taught modules but optional Research Seminars may be held at intervals during the academic year. These provide an opportunity for visiting scholars, WEST lecturers and WEST research students to present and discuss their current work.

WEST appoints two supervisors for each research student, at least one of whom is a faculty member. Student places are limited and WEST cannot guarantee the availability of a suitable supervisory team.

Sabbaticals

Taking a break?


Pastors and missionaries often want to take time away from ministry to receive fresh stimulation and make space for reflection and studying. WEST offers an ideal setting, with its wide range of learning resources and supportive community. Churches and agencies also benefit as a direct result of representatives spending sabbaticals here at WEST.

WEST welcomes applications from pastors, missionaries and other Christian workers who desire to make use of our facilities in this way. The School endeavours to be flexible concerning the length of such periods of study, although this may be subject to student numbers and availability of accommodation.

The benefits of taking time out at WEST include:

- Opportunity for reflection and rest
- Informal fellowship with staff and students
- Participation in prayer and worship services within the international WEST community
- Links with good Bible teaching churches in the area
- Assignment to a personal tutor
- Use of library facilities
- Guided reading
- Formal study





Campus

Library — WEST's recently computerised library is well-stocked, with over 25,000 specialist books, DVDs and CD-ROMS (a figure which is continually being added to). We currently subscribe to over 100 periodicals, some of which are available electronically, and students have access to a vast array of online materials through both Chester University's and our own e-learning portals. Study facilities with wireless internet access are available within the library area.

IT Facilities — Wireless internet access is also available throughout the campus. WEST provides email facilities for all students as well as access to an e-learning portal for information relating to courses of study. Each student is provided with a School email address to keep them up to date with news and changes to their timetables. Printing is available through a web portal.

Bookshop — There is a well-stocked Evangelical Movement of Wales bookshop and coffee shop in the College, which makes the ordering and purchase of books very straightforward. Students receive a discount on their book purchases.



Morning worship is held at 8.30 on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays during semesters. On Thursdays, the School welcomes distinguished guest speakers to preach at our longer midday service, which is open to the public.

Students are introduced into small pastoral groups, which meet once a week and are led by a lecturer. Time is spent in discipling one another, studying the Word and sharing needs and prayer. WEST staff are readily available to give private and confidential support, whether spiritual or purely practical.

Being at WEST is about building community. As we grow in our knowledge and love of God, we learn to better appreciate and serve each other. The lessons we learn together extend far beyond the classroom to mission, ministry and life as a whole.


Throughout their time at WEST, students are expected and encouraged to commit themselves actively to the life and witness of a local congregation, while maintaining and developing links with their home churches. Many churches locally also look to WEST for preachers, assistance in evangelism and youth/children's work.



Accommodation

WEST has two residential accommodation areas which, between them, contain over 30 comfortable, fully furnished study and twin bedrooms. A few double rooms with en suite bathrooms are available for married couples with no children. Each of the accommodation blocks has its own lounge and dining area, with fully equipped kitchen. There is a new, spacious student common room, a great place to relax and feel at home.

We provide mouth-watering lunches and evening meals to full-board students. Meal tickets can be purchased at a very reasonable cost by non-residents and College staff.



For those who live off-campus, Bridgend has a good property rental market. There are two large housing estates surrounding the College grounds.


Location

WEST's campus is on the western outskirts of the town of Bridgend, in the Vale of Glamorgan. The School has excellent motorway and mainline transportation links and Cardiff airport is just 10 miles away.

Partnerships



In September 2010, WEST entered into a collaborative partnership with the University of Chester, which now validates all our degree programmes. The Theology and Religious Studies Department at Chester was ranked 3rd in the UK in the National Student Survey and 8th in the Times University Guide in terms of graduate prospects.

In a recent review of the partnership, WEST was highly commended by the University for its support of students (both academically and pastorally), its commitment to improving its facilities and resources, and the way in which it monitors the quality of teaching and deals with student feedback.





European Evangelical Accrediting Association – WEST is proud to be an EEAA member. The European Evangelical Accrediting Association is a quality assurance network serving evangelical theological schools in Europe. The EEAA is an Affiliate Member of the European Evangelical Alliance (EEAA), a Charter Member of the International Council for Theological Education (ICETE), a Full Member of the International Network for Quality Assurance Agencies in Higher Education (INQAAHE) and an Affiliate of the European Association for Quality Assurance in Higher Education (ENQA).

The EEAA's mission is twofold. Its traditional identity is found in the accreditation of tertiary level evangelical theological education in Europe. In addition, the EEAA represents a dynamic network of European evangelical theological institutions and leaders that connect strategic resources in a common educational enterprise.



Cardiff and the Vale College, Cardiff – CAVC have been engaged by WEST to support and examine the teaching of 'English for Speakers of Other Languages'. This ESOL component is core to the WEST International Foundation Course.



Chongshin University, South Korea – Chongshin University is dedicated to a Bible-centred and reformed world-view, and to raising servant-hearted leaders for the Church of Jesus Christ under the supervision of the Presbyterian Church in Korea (Hapdong). Some Chongshin students have received generous scholarships from WEST for our International Foundation Course. WEST students have spent time in Chongshin, benefiting from classes and cultural interchange.

As part of an ongoing process, WEST does not merely rest upon the successful outcome of the QAA assessment, but uses the reporting cycle to critically examine and improve both quality systems and, more importantly, service delivery to our students.

For international students who have the academic qualifications but not the English language skills, the International Foundation Course prepares your English for academic study and supports you during your time at WEST. Local churches are very welcoming and especially to international students who have a passion to connect with local people.
